### **MIN 1/06/2020: Preliminary**

The meeting started at 9.45 am with the team leader welcoming all the members and refreshed the new members on the agenda of the meeting. Thereafter self-introduction was done

### **MIN 2/06/2020: An overview Presentation of the UEP**

Members were taken through the UEP process by Mr. Elliott, Simon. The presenter highlighted the SUED UEP journey that included the inception phase, diagnostics phase, technical briefing and UEP drafting.

The main focus of the presentation was on the development framework. **Three focus** areas were highlighted as follows:

#### **1. Focal area 1: Town Centre**

The sub themes and interventions covered:

- ✓ Relocation of bus terminal
- ✓ Public square to replace bus terminal
- ✓ Town centre gateway improvement
- ✓ Pedestrian main street
- ✓ Green links with SUDs
- ✓ Street lighting
- ✓ Boda Boda sites

#### **2. Light Industrial Cluster**

The sub themes and interventions covered:

- ✓ Phase 1 Infrastructure development
- ✓ Waste water treatment plant
- ✓ Existing road upgrade



- ✓ Location for new bus stops
- ✓ Boda boda sites

### **3. Blue-Green Corridor**

The sub themes and interventions covered:

- ✓ Removal of existing Landfill
- ✓ Sorting and recycling facility
- ✓ Improvement to sewage and sanitation network
- ✓ Development of linear park infrastructure
- ✓ Solar street lighting along pathway

The second part of the presentation highlighted Implementation Plan which gave a breakdown of implementation costs and potential funding sources.

#### **MIN 4/6/2020: Reaction to presentation**

Members applauded the report and confirmed that the proposals presented were just as agreed during the public participation. It was observed that once those proposals are implemented they will serve as long term solution to issues facing Kitui Municipality which include, but not limited to unemployment, Congestion in Town and poor solid waste management.

It came to the notice of members that there are programmes that the County government of Kitui has already initiated in order to ensure job creation. These initiatives include; Capacity building through vocational trainings to youth, provision for employment to those youths who are currently cleaning and making culverts. The Kitui County affordable housing programme is also aimed at attracting more investors in Kitui town thus improving the economy and living standards of Kitui municipality residents.

Members were informed that the proposed site for industrial park (the area between Unyaa and Ithokwe airstrip) is a private land thus land compensation/ acquisition should be factored in the project costing. It was highlighted that Kanyonyoo area is a public land though it's outside the Kitui municipality that had been zoned for industrial use. The already zoned industrial proposal should accommodate some of the SUED proposals.

#### **MIN 3/6/2020: Update on SUED's follow on support and introduction of OCA team**

Members were informed that SUED has identified some development projects which were considered sustainable in Kitui Town and Municipality at large. One among the projects is establishment of a honey processing Center. It was explained that SUED team had approached and will work closely with the Standard Chattered Bank so as to identify and finance the available investment interests and how to coordinate and provide for these activities.





The SUED team will also be visiting Kitui Municipality to establish the available resources that can be chipped in to support the realization of the SUED agenda. The visit shall however be informed by the Presidential directives and Ministry of Health guidelines to be issued with respect to the controlled inter-county movements.

The team leader further introduced the Open Capital Advisers members who shall be taking the lead in the next phase of the project which shall involve investment attraction for the purpose of implementing the identified projects.

**MIN 4/6/2020: Way forward**

Members agreed that they were ready to proceed to investment Attraction Phase of the programme. A Kick off meeting between the Kitui Municipal representatives and Open Capital advisors shall be held in one week time. The proposed date is on 30<sup>th</sup> June or 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2020. Members were requested to choose the day that works for them.

It was further agreed that the Municipal Board has adopted the Kitui UEP and this shall be formalized by the signing of the minutes which shall be further be delivered to SUED in hard copy within 1 week of the meeting. This shall pave way to the launch of the UEP which shall be done in Kitui or virtually depending on the outcome of the anticipated COVID 19 directives to be issued.

It was also agreed that an UEP introductory meeting with the Kitui County Governor and the CECMs shall be held thereafter launching the UEP report.

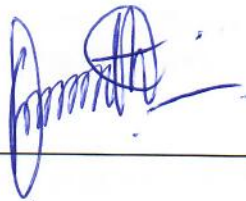

### **MIN 1/12/5/2020: Preliminary**

The meeting started at 9.30 am with the Board Chair welcoming all the members and requested Mary Mbandi to open the meeting with a short prayer. Thereafter self-introduction was done.

The chair further requested the CECM to give a welcome note and invite Nicodemus Mbwika from the COG to moderate the session. The CECM thanked the technical working group from the Municipality and the acknowledged the input from both Nicodemus and Dr. Midheme in preparation of the document.

### **MIN 2/12/5/2020: An overview Presentation of the IDEP**

The CECM pointed out that the development of the IDEP was a requisite requirement for the Municipality as provided by the Urban Areas and Cities Act. He pointed out that in the previous mid-year assessment, Kitui Municipality had scored quite poorly due to lack of the document and had almost missed out on the funding from the World Bank under the KUSP project as the document was also part of the minimum conditions to be met.

He then ushered Dr. Midheme to give an overview of the IDEP.

In his introduction, Dr. Midheme pointed out that Constitution of Kenya and the Urban Areas and Cities Act bestows enormous responsibility of managing cities and municipalities upon the boards of Cities and Municipalities. This responsibility calls for the boards to adopt integrated and strategic thinking that allows them to focus on projects that generate significant development impact and multiplier effects if the boards are to achieve any tangible development during their five-year tenure. It is with this responsibility and the desire to offer the best services to the people of Kitui Municipality in mind that the Kitui Municipal Board has developed this Integrated Plan.

He proceeded to underscore that the plan covers the period 2020–2025. Being the first integrated plan prepared by the inaugural Kitui Municipal Board, the Plan deliberately lays emphasis on creating the requisite institutional structures that would enable the Board to operate smoothly. It is on these grounds that the Board believes that it is important to get these structures right from the onset as a precondition for the bigger responsibility bestowed upon it by the Urban Areas and Cities Act and the Kitui Municipal Charter. This emphasis should however not be construed to mean that the Board will not pay attention to other aspects of development of the Municipality.

Dr Midheme emphasized that the Board envisages that it will concurrently pursue economic development and infrastructure and service provision alongside laying this foundation for good governance as the key pillars that summarize its responsibility to the people of Kitui Municipality. These pillars are founded in international and national



development aspirations, such as the New Urban Agenda, the Kenya Vision 2030 and the Big Four Agenda.

Finally he explained that the IDEP identifies key strategic projects that will be completed during the 2020–2025 plan period. These projects are in tune with the aspirations of the local development plans. In essence therefore, this integrated plan seeks to steer the Municipality in a clear direction as it charts a common destiny for various development pursuits of the line ministries and other development partners in Kitui County.

**MIN 4/12/5/2020: Reaction to presentation**

After the presentation, the following observations/ reactions were given

a) Population projections

It is critical to get the most recent population information for the municipality. The same should be sourced from KNBS Kitui office

b) Priority projects

All the ongoing KUSP, SUED and Symbiocity project under Kitui Municipality should be captured in the IDEP

c) Graphics and photographs

The plan should incorporate as much graphics as possible depicting various aspects including geography, infrastructure, attractions etc. This includes Nzambani Rock and Museve Shrines

d) Integration of project development

The IDEP's priority projects should adopt an integrated approach in both design and execution

### **MIN 1/28/5/2020: Preliminary**

The meeting started at 10.05 am with the Board Chair welcoming all the members and requested Grace Njambi to open the meeting with a short prayer. Thereafter self-introduction was done.

The chair further requested the CECM to give a welcome note and invite Nicodemus Mbwika from the COG to moderate the session. The CECM thanked the technical working group from the Municipality and acknowledged the input from both Nicodemus and Dr. Alando in preparation of the document.

### **MIN 2/28/5/2020: An overview Presentation of the Strategic Plan**

Mr. Mbwika pointed out that the development of the strategic plan just as the IDEP was a requisite requirement for the Municipality as provided by the Urban Areas and Cities Act. He pointed out that in the previous mid year assessment, Kitui Municipality had scored quite poorly due to lack of the document and had almost missed out on the funding from the World Bank under the KUSP project as the document was also part of the minimum conditions to be met. He then ushered Dr. Alando to give an overview of the plan.

Dr. Alando pointed out that the successful completion of the preparation of the strategic plan is a land mark for the Municipality of Kitui. This Plan epitomizes the gains of participatory planning and communicates the vision of the people of Kitui town. The plan will be implemented in five years starting from 2020 and ending in 2024. This timeframe gives a window of formulation of policies and implementation of the plan. The strategic plan 2020-2024 is a pioneer and will be very instrumental in setting the foundation for a thriving Municipality. It offers strategies that device new revenue streams as well as boasting the existing ones. The plan is set on ensuring that Sustainable urbanization is achieved while revolutionizing how the major sectors that drive the municipal economy exist symbiotically.

He further emphasized that the economic viability of the plan will ensure that the potential investors have a blueprint for development. This will be realized by the viable strategies for sustainable development such as land banking in order to ensure that future endeavors such as large scale farming, industrialization, and social housing can be realized.

According to the plan, the focus shall be on six key areas over the next five years:

- i) Consolidating the legal and policy basis for the operations of the Board
- ii) Reworking the organisational structure of the Municipality to enable the Board to deliver its mandate



- iii) Responding to the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic in the short-run and sustaining the long-term economic growth of the Municipality
- iv) Positioning Municipality of Kitui to use its locational advantage for its development
- v) Strengthening partnerships and collaborations with existing organization's for the development of the Municipality
- vi) Venturing into other sources of funding to sustain development funding beyond current donor support

He further reiterated that plan provides the strategic direction for the Municipality over the period 2020 - 2024. It prioritizes the formulation of policies and enactment of laws to enable the Board of Municipality of Kitui consolidate the legal and institutional foundation for its operations. He noted that although the functions of the Board have already been clearly defined, its requisite staff recruited, and office accommodation allocated, it still does not have a strong policy and legal framework to support its operations. There is a need to correct this gap in order to enable it to operate on a sound legal and policy footing. This, in addition to other priority development concerns of the Municipality.

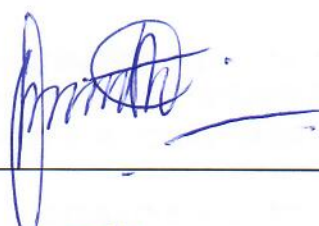

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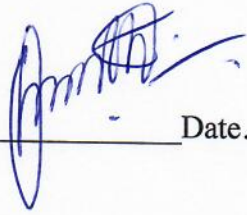
